**Question:** Standardized testing was not completed this last year due to the stay at home order. How is math placement decided for students? Can math placement be adjusted later in the year or will this put a child behind?

**Answer:** Placement is determined by your child's previous school record. We also look at the available standardized scores. Even during a typical year, Spring testing results do not come until the mid-Fall, so we look at the scores from 2 years ago.

If you feel the placement is incorrect, reach out to the teacher sooner than later. We can move their class but typically a large part of their schedule will change to accommodate a math class change.

<b>Answer:</b> You cannot change the combination. Our lockers are not designed to allow students to change the combination.
